

The Pastor's Page

"Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles." (1 Cor. 1:22-23). That's kind of an odd thing for Paul to say, isn't it? Not the part about Jews seeking signs and stumbling over Christ. That makes perfect sense. In fact, we hear in John 2:18 about a specific instance when the Jews demanded a sign from Jesus and then stumbled over his answer.

No, I mean the part about Greeks seeking wisdom and seeing folly in the crucifixion and resurrection. Paul doesn't explain that statement much. And it's actually kind of important.

Because Greek wisdom forms the backdrop for pretty much the entire New Testament church. In fact, it forms the foundation for the way most modern Christians think. As the result of influential philosophers like Plato and Aristotle, we tend to be fundamentally "Greek" in the way we look at the world.

And pretty much all Greek philosophers share one thing in common: they view the physical world as less important than the spiritual or metaphysical world. Plato, for example, viewed the physical world as a shadow of reality. Something we view only through the foggy interpretation of our senses, but which has a greater, more important spiritual reality that we can't see. Aristotle said something similar, arguing that understanding reality in abstract, philosophical terms was far more important than understanding the physical appearance of things.

These ideas tend to make sense for Christians. After all, we worship a God who is spirit and comes to us in His Holy Spirit. We believe we have a soul. We believe in spiritual beings like angels and demons, and in spiritual places like heaven and hell. We believe in the importance

of abstract terms like good and evil, righteousness and sin, clean and unclean.

And yet, these are not all we believe. And it's easy for us to get so caught up in them that we lose sight of everything else. To get so caught up in the spiritual and abstract, that we miss the very real, very important physical dimensions of our faith.

We do believe in a God who is spirit. But we also believe in a God who became man. We do believe we have a soul. But we also believe we have a body, and it was a good gift of God from the very beginning. We do believe in spiritual beings and places, but we also believe that God made this earth and all the people in it.

Maybe most of all, we do believe in abstract things like righteousness and sin. But we also believe in concrete things like righteousness and sin. That good and evil are things we think and say and do. And they have very real, physical consequences for us. Consequences like suffering and death.

And this is why all of our faith turns on one key line of the Creed: "On the third day, He rose from the dead." According to Greek wisdom, this is foolishness. 'Who cares about these stupid bodies,' they say. 'We're better off without them.'

But we're not better off without them. Because God made us with a body, not just a soul. And this body needs redemption. Spiritual sanctification is important. But physical resurrection is just as important. And Easter guarantees us both. Jesus was the first of many brothers to be raised from the dead and, because of that, we know that our resurrection is coming soon (Rom. 8:29).

The cross and empty tomb are foolishness to those who are perishing. They are foolishness to those who think only of the spiritual and abstract. To those who put their trust in human wisdom and understanding.

But to us who are called by God and are being saved, they are the power and wisdom of God. For the crucifixion shows us that the punishment for sin is very real and very physical. It is death, plain and simple. But it also shows us that the grace of God is also very real and very physical. It is resurrection and restoration and a new creation. It is life – eternal life – for all who believe.

Christ is risen! Alleluia!

CONGREGATION ASSEMBLY MEETING

February 18, 2018

Call to Order: President Tim Meller called the meeting to order.

Opening Prayer: Pastor Joshua Ketelsen opened with prayer.

Acceptance/Amendments of Agenda: a motion was made by Gene Cummins to add a discussion of the electronics under Board of Property. The motion was seconded by Ray Schrader. Motion passed to amend agenda to include this discussion.

Pastor's Report: Pastor stated that we are into the Lenten Season and Wednesday services have begun. Pastor stated the Lenten Series is fun, and he hopes we enjoy it as much as he does. End of March is Holy Week; Maundy Thursday is March 29th, March 30th is Good Friday, and April 1st is Easter. He has been discussing with Elders the possibility of Wednesday night services all through the year. Elders are still working through making sure an Elder and an Organist would be available and present. Any feedback is encouraged regarding the Wednesday night consideration, talk to Bob Schnetzler, Elders, or Pastor. It would be an alternate opportunity for those who cannot attend on Sunday.

President's Report: No report.

Vice President: No report.

Secretary: No report.

Treasurer's Report: Suzanne stated she opened a Memorial Fund – a donation of \$5,000 was deposited into this new account.

The church is supporting the Kindergarten expenses at this time. The Kindergarten school year ends June 30, 218, and the Treasurer will deduct expenses from the \$50,000.00 at the end of the school year. The \$50,000.00 is included in the LCEF fund and will remain there at this time. Suzanne will keep track of the balance of the \$50,000.00 donation. Gene Cummins made a motion to deduct this expenditure annually at the end of the school year. The motion was seconded by Sharron Toellner. The motion passed.

Elder's Report: Bob Schnetzler presented this typed report of February 4, 2018. Marlynn and Kay Dexter transferred their membership to Holy Cross, Kearney, NE, and Lindy and Valerie Holley to Campus Lutheran, Columbia, MO. Pastor will be on vacation from April 18-25. Pastor Spotts will be filling in for him during this time.

Board of Property: Chairman of Board of Property not present. Gene Cummins stated that due to the breaker boxes in the church, our insurance company (GuideOne) will not renew until we update, they are considered a hazard. An estimate obtained by Billy Wells from a company in Columbia was \$12k to update. Gene obtained an estimate from John Norberry was for \$3,400.00 to replace the 3 boxes, no paper estimate received yet. It was suggested to do this in the summer when school is out. Gene still has a phone call to make to verify replace or not replace the large box. (\$12K - \$14K if that is included. A motion to proceed to have the Board of Property to get the best price to replace the breaker boxes necessary to continue our insurance was made by Larry Davis, seconded by Suzanne Ayers. Motion passed

Board of Christian Education: Josh Cromley, DCE, presented a verbal report. High School Lock-In on April 24, 2018 includes all high school students in the circuit, it is a multi-congregation lock-in. On January 29 and 30, 2018, Josh was at a symposium/conference. They discussed the young kids today as Generation Z. the discussion included how a child today is unable to copy an action or behavior they do not see at home. Parents need to remember the promises made at Baptism. There are not as many millennials in the church. Many individuals have not returned after having children. Also they discussed retaining people – connecting with others in church and in bible study. February 17, 2018 Josh attended the youth ministry discussion – where two or three are gathered... Easter Breakfast is on April 1, 2018. Thrivent cards are much appreciated. The Thrivent cards helped them to raise money – they brought in about \$700 last year, the Thrivent cards really helped. The griddles need replacing (very old). The weekend after Easter, April 6-8, is the district youth gathering at Camp Windermere. Nation Youth Gathering next summer, USBank Stadium, will be working on fund raising, very beneficial activity. Our kids will probably go with some of the congregations from Columbia. VBS will be June 25-29, 5:30 to 7:30 pm 27 volunteers last year Adults – time Lab – Christ present through all eternity. Friday will be the program, congregation and all families invited for BBQ/celebration (week after Heritage Days – some type

of participation in parade). Last year the large pre-registration was due to parade participation (handing out forms).

School Board: Typed report of Feb 13, 218 was presented. For the 2018-2019 school year there are 22 enrolled for the M/W/F AM class, 7 in the M/W/F PM class, and 12 in the TU/TH AM class. There are 6 enrollment forms for the Kindergarten class turned in at this time with one form still out, so possibly 7.

Board of Evangelism: Terry Ehlers discussed the Evangelism budget and noted a couple members have volunteered to anonymously cover the expense for Dial-A-Prayer in the coming year.

Board of Fellowship: Fellowship breakfast after service next Sunday.

A motion to accept all reports presented at this meeting was made by Becky Ehlers, seconded by Suzanne Ayers. The motion passed.

New Business: Preschool will need aide for the TU/TH PM class as more than 10 children are in the class. The expense is approximately \$60 a week added to the preschool budget. A motion made by Gene Cummins to approve the addition of the aide. The motion was seconded by Terry Ehlers. The motion passed.

Adjournment: a motion by Gene Cummins to adjourn was seconded by Jeff Clark. Motion passed.

Closing Prayer: Pastor Josh Ketelsen led the attendees in the Lord's Prayer.


