The Pastor's Page

Last week, I saw the best new Disney movie I've seen in a long time. Inside Out 2 was truly a wonderful movie and one that, as a father and a pastor, I can wholeheartedly recommend. It was funny, poignant, and really quite insightful, just as its predecessor was.

If you're not familiar with the premise, both of the Inside Out movies revolve around the inner workings of the mind in a girl named Riley, where her emotions are personified as characters taking turns controlling her reactions to different events. In the first movie, Riley was 11 and dealing with the emotions of Joy, Anger, Fear, Disgust, and Sadness. In this second film, she is now 13 and struggling with the new emotions of Anxiety, Envy, Ennui, and Embarrassment.

Yet, I recently read an interview with the director of Inside Out 2, Kelsey Mann, and found that he almost included another emotion for Riley to experience: Shame. Having seen the movie now, I can definitely imagine where Shame would have fit into the plot. But Mann decided not to include Shame in the end.

His reason was that Shame "was not fun to watch... It was too heavy." That's understandable. Shame is a powerful emotion and not a cheerful one. For a kids' movie, it makes sense to leave Shame out.

On the other hand, I can't help feeling like the movie sacrificed something important through this editorial decision. Shame is a very real emotion, one that teenagers definitely experience. In fact, shame emerges in a child's life long before the age of 13.

That's because shame is a function of God's Law. As Paul writes in Romans 3, the Law does not exist to justify us, but to make aware of our sin. The Law is a mirror that reminds us of all the sinful things we have done. And the end result is that we feel guilt and shame for being less than God created us to be. This is what Adam and Eve experienced in the Garden of Eden. They disobeyed God by eating the forbidden fruit and immediately looked at themselves and felt shame. They hadn't physically changed by eating the fruit, but they had changed spiritually. In fact, God's warning to them had been fulfilled: they spiritually died the moment they disobeyed him. And they were ashamed at what they had become.

Shame is a powerful emotion. And it is not a fun emotion to experience, especially for an unbeliever. Which, I think, may be the real reason why Kelsey Mann left Shame out of Inside Out 2. Without Christ, there is no real solution to the feeling of shame. You can hide it under a veneer of self-righteousness. Subdue it a bit through reconciliation with those you've wronged. Drown-out its voice with other voices – internal and external – that say you're a good person. But you can't really make shame go away. Not by your own power, at least.

The only one who can drive shame out of our lives is the God whose Law put shame into our lives in the first place. Only the Creator can repair his creation. Only the Author of Life can raise us from the dead – physically and spiritually.

And so, later in the book of Romans, Paul tells us with confidence, *"There is therefore now no* condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus. For the law of the Spirit of life has set you free in Christ Jesus from the law of sin and death." By faith in the work of Christ, you are set free from your sins. You are set free from death. You are set free from your shame. Shame may say you have sinned, but Christ says you have a Savior.

Kelsey Mann says he left Shame out of Inside Out 2 because it was not fun to watch and too heavy. But, really, he left Shame out because the character of Riley isn't a Christian, and Shame is an overwhelming emotion without the forgiveness of Jesus Christ. Kelsey Mann solved the problem of Shame by ignoring it. But I have a better solution to the problem of Shame: give your Shame to Jesus. Nail it to His cross. And be free from it forever.

Call to Order: President Gene Cummins called the meeting to order.

Opening Prayer: Pastor Ketelsen opened the meeting with prayer.

Acceptance/Amendments of Agenda: Craig Meyer moved for acceptance of the agenda as presented. Seconded by Jason Linneman and the motion carried.

council meeting were accepted as presented. Minutes of the May 19 Congregational Assembly meeting were reviewed and accepted as presented.

Pastor's Report

- a. Pastor Ketelsen reports confirmation will be held June 30 with celebration of holy communion.
- Pastor will take vacation the week of July 14-21; leaving after church service on the 14th. He will arrange for a pastoral fill-in for Sunday, July 21.
- c. Vacation Bible School will be held July 29 August 2.

President's Report: No report.

Secretary's Report: No report.

Treasurer's Report

- a. Not present. Written report submitted and reviewed.
- Gayle Linneman inquired about the kindergarten/preschool budget information; President Cummins advised it is separate and was not included in the council's report by the accounting firm.
- c. Craig commented that the profit/loss line item is the change in value of the investment accounts. These values are not indicative of the performance of the church budget. President Cummins commented that while it is not, that change in value could be used in budgetary needs.
- d. Gayle inquired about the donations account line item on the monthly balance sheet; this is the electronic giving program (ECH) through LCEF; Pastor reports he believes there are 8-10 members currently using the program; there will be an announcement made to remind the congregation of this service.

Elder's Report

Written report presented and discussed.

- a. Social media (Facebook) continues to be used to share information with the community.
- Pastor reminded officers to submit bio information to Stefani to be used in the "Ministry Monday" postings.
- c. Discussion and planning has started for the church picnic in September.
- d. Elders will meet with confirmands on the evening of June 23.

Board of Property

- a. Chair Darren Linneman reports he plans to meet with the prior Chair for an overview and status of facilities.
- b. Pastor Ketelsen reports the low water pressure has been corrected with the pressure pump installation.
- c. There was discussion of having congregational participation in church workdays for various needs around the church property.

Craig moved and Jason seconded a motion to approve the board reports as presented. Motion carried.


