The Pastor's Page

"Pastor, I've just been really struggling with my faith lately." I've heard some variation of that statement from three different people over the past couple months. It's something I hear from parishioners every now and then, but the sudden uptick kinda surprised me. I'm not sure why so many people have been feeling this way recently.

And, to be honest, I don't know that all three cases were really identical. Saying that you're "struggling with your faith" can mean different things to different people. It can mean that you're not feeling motivated to come to church or read your Bible. It can mean that some sin or vice has been tempting you. It can mean that you've been having doubts about the truth of God's Word. Often it can mean that you just feel like God is absent and your prayers aren't being heard. "Struggling with your faith" can mean many different things, depending on the person and the circumstance.

I'm glad these people came to me though. And if you're feeling the same way, I would encourage you to reach out to me too. The struggle over matters of faith is not something we need to engage in alone. I think most pastors feel the same way as St Paul when he wrote to the Romans, *"For I long to see you, that I may impart to you some spiritual gift to strengthen you— that is, that we may be mutually encouraged by each other's faith, both yours and mine." (Romans 1:12)* Not only do I desire to encourage you, but I am likewise encouraged when I do.

But back to the matter at hand, how do we handle those times when we feel like we're struggling with our faith? Well, I have two pieces of wisdom to offer in that regard. They're not earth-shattering revelations, but maybe they'll help. They seemed to be useful to the three individuals I already spoke to.

First, it's worth asking yourself, "Am I struggling with my faith, or am I struggling with sin?" Yes, we do

occasionally wrestle with questions of faith. Of how we should interpret and apply God's Word to our lives. That is a struggle, sometimes.

But, in my experience, the bigger daily struggle is with our old Adam. And with the lies from the devil that the old Adam likes to hear. The devil is a masterful liar and the old Adam is a gullible fool who believes every sinful thing he hears. And it is a constant struggle to drown him in the waters of your baptism, that a new man may rise up and cling to the truth of Jesus Christ.

Yet, the fact that you're struggling isn't a bad thing. Which leads to my second piece of wisdom: faith is the reason we struggle. If we didn't have faith, we wouldn't bother struggling. We'd give in. We'd believe the lie. We'd abandon God's Word, God's Church, God's Sacraments. Without faith, we'd abandon it all and give ourselves over to the world.

So the fact that you're struggling isn't a sign of weak faith. It isn't a sign that there's something wrong with your faith. It isn't a sign that God has abandoned you.

On the contrary, it's a sign that God has filled you with His Holy Spirit and empowered you to fight. He has given you the strength to wrestle with these questions and to see the error of your past sins and to see the temptations that now plague you and to find encouragement as despair threatens you. You are struggling specifically because your faith is alive and healthy and doing exactly what it's supposed to do: reject the lies of the devil and seek out the truth of God's Word.

I hope that is some comfort for you. And if it's not, as I said, come see me. Let me encourage you. Faith is always a struggle. But it doesn't need to be a lonely struggle.

CONGREGATIONAL ASSEMBLY MEETING May 19, 2024

Call to Order: President Gene Cummins called the meeting to order.

Opening Prayer: Pastor Ketelsen opened with prayer asking for guidance as we make decisions regarding the Lord's work.

Acceptance of New Assembly Members: None present. Acceptance of Agenda/Amendments of Agenda: None Approval of Minutes of the February 18, 2024 Congregational Assembly Meeting: Correction of minutes was noted: under "New Business – Item 4b: should read: "Tim Derendinger suggested that the Church consider making a significant investment in Evangelism that will be beneficial in the community." Motion to accept minutes as corrected was made by Earl Mangels and seconded by Tim Derendinger. Motion passed. Pastor's Report: Given in the Elders' report.

Reports of Officers:

President: Gene Cummins complimented Jason Linneman, nominating chairman, for his time and effort spent in securing candidates for elected positions.

Vice President: No report.

Secretary: Not present, no report.

Treasurer: Gene Cummins presented the printed financial report in Kim Toellner's absence. Kim indicated to Gene that YTD income is \$41,000 and YTD expenses are \$50,000. Kim continues to work with Serck's office to improve accounting reports.

Board of Elders: Gary Naumann presented the report. He said the Samaritan Fund's balance to date was \$4,147.24.

Other Elder business noted in the report are:

Funeral for Ottis Lawson was held on May 7.

Confirmation of confirmands will possibly be at the end of June.

School Board is searching for a second Kindergarten teacher and a Preschool aide for the 2024-25 school year.

Ascension Day service was held on May 9.

The LCMS Hospital Chaplain-Columbia position has been vacant since 2020. The call process has been started for a new Chaplain.

Elder assignments are made through November.

Board of Property: Billy Wells thanked Gene and Craig for taking down the Easter display. He also noted that a pressure tank was added to help with the Church's water pressure issue.

Board of Christian Education: a printed report was considered in absence of the Chairman. It was noted that Sunday School is on break for the summer. There are currently three teachers lined up and an additional 1-2 are needed. Vacation Bible School is scheduled for July 29-August 2.

School Board: a financial report was presented in absence of the chairman. A budget for the 2024-25 school year will be available at the August Congregational Assembly meeting for consideration and approval.

Board of Stewardship: Sharon Strough reported on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. Two Thrivent gift cards were used for expenses. There's a fifth Sunday in June. It was decided to move the Fifth Sunday Fellowship to July 14th to commemorate Pastor's 15th year of ministry.

A motion to approve all reports was given by Gary Naumann and seconded by Earl Mangels. Motion carried.

Unfinished Business: None

New Business:

Election of Officers: Only one Board had a contested race. The President asked for nominations from the floor. As there were none, balloting took place. Newly elected officers are:

President: Gene Cummins; **Council Secretary:** Tammy Meyer; **Board of Property Chairman:** Darren Linneman; **School Board Chairman:** Gayle Linneman; **Elders:** Tim Fahrenbrink and Cody Waibel.

Announcements: Julie Thacher mentioned that Immanuel might consider being more active on social media. She indicated how other churches use their social media page as an outreach in the community and beyond. Stefani Ketelsen said she has done and continues to work on keeping Immanuel's page current. She noted that information needs to be "liked" and "shared" or leave a comment to help create more activity.

Adjournment: There being no further business to discuss, Earl Mangels motioned to adjourn and seconded by Billy Wells. Motion carried. All joined in praying the Lord's Prayer.
