The Pastor's Page

When most people in the church think about Easter, they picture a single day filled with lilies, colorful eggs, and shouts of "Christ is risen!" Churches are filled with people in their finest clothes. Families gather for meals. It is a joyful celebration, as it should be.

Yet, for the Church, Easter is not merely a day. It is a season. In fact, Easter is the very heart of our life together as Christians. It is not only a celebration that extends for fifty full days, but a celebration that shapes every Sunday of the entire year.

Unfortunately, that's not how we always treat Easter. Easter is often treated like Christmas (which also tends to get cheated out of its full season): once the festivities are over, life returns to normal. Decorations are packed away. Attention shifts to the next item on the calendar.

But, for the Church, Easter is not something we move past. It is the continual reality that defines who we are. Christ's resurrection from the dead is not only the central event of history. It is the source of our faith, our hope, and our eternal life. As St. Paul says, "If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins" (1 Corinthians 15:17).

But Christ has been raised. Death has been conquered. Sin has been defeated. The devil has been overthrown. And this victory is too great to be confined to a single morning!

That is why the Church celebrates Easter as a full season. The Easter season lasts for seven weeks, culminating in the Feast of Pentecost. During these weeks, the Church continues to gather around the risen Lord in Word and Sacrament. We continue to sing the Easter hymns, hear the resurrection appearances of Jesus, and receive His peace through the forgiveness of sins. We continue to rejoice that Christ, once crucified for our transgressions, now lives and reigns for all eternity. Each Sunday in the Easter season is like another little Easter, another day of resurrection joy.

But even beyond these seven weeks, every Sunday throughout the year is a "little Easter." A celebration of Christ's victory over death. That is why Christians worship on Sunday rather than Saturday, and have since the days of the early church. Already in the book of Acts, St Luke writes, "On the first day of the week, when we were gathered together to break bread..." (Acts 20:7). For those first Christians, Sunday almost immediately became the day that the Church met to hear the Word, receive the Sacrament, and celebrate the risen Christ.

Easter, therefore, is not a single holiday we remember once a year. It is the ongoing reality in which we live. We are baptized into Christ's death and resurrection. We daily die to sin and rise to newness of life through repentance and forgiveness. We live every day in the sure hope that because Christ lives, we too shall live.

This is a great comfort to us in a world still full of death, sorrow, and suffering. When troubles come, when grief overwhelms us, when death casts its long shadow over our lives, we are not left without hope. Christ has already entered into death for us and shattered its power. The empty tomb stands as a promise that those who trust in Him will not remain in the grave. As Jesus Himself says, "Because I live, you also will live" (John 14:19).

So how can we, as Christians, keep the Easter season? First and foremost, by continuing to gather around Christ's gifts each Sunday. By hearing His Word, receiving His Body and Blood, and singing with joy the hymns of resurrection. By remembering daily in our prayers and devotions that we are the redeemed children of the risen Lord. By living in the freedom and hope that the resurrection brings. Not being enslaved to sin, not living in fear of death, but walking in the new life given to us by grace.

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! These words are not only for Easter morning. They are for every

day of our lives. In the Church, Easter never really ends, because Christ's victory never ends. His resurrection is not just an event we remember; it is the reality in which we now live, and the glory that we shall one day see with our own eyes.

District Youth Gathering 2025

We were thrilled to welcome over 380 participants – Junior High, Senior High, and adult leaders – from across the Missouri District to the 2025 District Youth Gathering, held April 4-6 at Cross Pointe Retreat Center in Rocky Mount, MO.

This annual event brought together students in grades 6-12 for a weekend filled with worship, learning, service, and fellowship. The theme of the weekend, centered on John 20:31, invited students to deepen their belief in Jesus as the Son of God and to grow in faith as followers of the Triune God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Junior high youth participated in several hands-on projects to share God's love with others. Together, they: created 300 Christian bookmarks with prayers and Bible verses for children and teens in Hooper Bay, Alaska; made 80 salvation bracelets; prepared cross craft kits; wrote encouraging cards and thank-you notes; and stuffed 1,100 Easter eggs to bless children in need.

High school students participated in YouthLead breakout sessions, where 98 peers explored how to support struggling friends using LOAP (Listen, Observe, Ask, Pray) model through peer-led discussion and practical tools.

The weekend offered a powerful combination of spiritual growth, leadership development, and meaningful connection. It was a blessing to see students live out their faith and return home equipped to shine the light of Christ in their communities.
